








# Literary Terms

Representation	English Literary Term	Definition
	character	A person, being, creature, animal, or living thing in a story. Characters talk, feel, think, and act, moving the plot along.
	setting	The time and place (when and where) the story takes place.
	conflict, or what gives rise to your story	A struggle between two forces Internal conflict: mental and/or emotional conflicts that occur within a character External conflict: A conflict with outside forces
	perspective	The lens through which the reader experiences the characters and events
	point of view	The angle from which the story is told. First-person: The story is told through the eyes of a character in the story Second-person: The narrator is talking to the audience Third-person: The narrator is not a part of the story. She/he is a spectator and unable to read the characters' minds.
	turning point climax	The highest point of tension in a narrative structure. This is usually when the main conflict is faced.
	resolution	The unfolding or solution of the conflict
	theme	The universal idea or message that holds the text together. It is a complete thought that applies across time, space, and people.
